Galatians 2:20

1. Why is Paul concerned about the Galatians (Gal. 1:6)? How can he relate to their aspirations to follow the Law? Why did Paul leave that “old way” of life”? (Read Galatians 2:16-21)
2. In what ways have you left your “old way” of life? Since sin clings closely (Heb. 12:1) why is a passage like this and Romans 6:3-12 so important for us to remember?
3. How do you think Jared’s point of using the metaphor of horse and buggy related to the passage in Galatians 2:20? What might it look like to be riding in a “horse and buggy” spiritually?
4. What difference does it make if any to say that we died with Christ rather than just Christ died for me? Why is personalizing the death of Jesus to us important? How might it change the value of a life to know that Jesus, the Son of God, died for you, for your neighbor, for your enemy?
5. Why do we often let the mistakes and sins of our past define our present relationship with him? How can we use those things in our past to worship and give thanks to our gracious God? In your experience, do you think grace (defined in this context as God’s undeserved gift of mercy and eternal love) is transformative? How has the grace of God changed your life? How might we respond to the grace of our Lord with the remaining time we have in life?
